She just heard before the Site Council meeting that out of all the schools that applied Pistor was chosen to be a pilot school which will make Pistor a Visible Learning School and bring in some resources for the campus. Mrs. Gunnels went on to mention that Pistor has lost funding due to the number of students enrolled which means that Pistor will be losing teachers going into</p>

Luckily, we had some teachers volunteer to move to another school.</p> <p>We do have some open positions that will need to be filled for 25/26 which are Student Success Specialist, ELD, new custodian as well as a new Spanish teacher.</p> <p>Master Schedule is completed and 84% of registered students have been scheduled.</p> <p>Discipline ---</p> <p>Mrs. Daniel started off by letting everyone know that our yearly water wars has started up with the students as well as the confetti eggs are back.</p> <p>Mrs. Daniel let the council know that when it comes to the confetti eggs due to the amount of extra work it adds to the custodial staff anyone caught with confetti eggs will do community service and clean up around the campus.</p> <p>As for the water wars due to the cafeteria giving out bottles and us not being able to stop them from doing so she is currently looking for positive things for the students to do and is talking to the student population to figure out the best ones.</p> <p>Mrs. Daniel also mentioned that on testing days any class that is 30 to 35 minutes long is to not let students out of class.
